




# Working service point for international student applications

- Determination of their equivalence to German educational standards




 Processing of about 300.000 student applications from over 180 countries and regions worldwide every year

## 1. Get information

At each university of your choice:

- Find out if uni-assist is responsible
- Get information on courses offered
- Check admission criteria
- Check application deadlines

# 2. Apply in 6 steps via uni-assist



## 2. Plan your application

Note information at uni-assist.de on:

- Procedures (regular, VPD, DOSV)
- Deadlines and processing times



Apply as early as possible, ideally at least **8 weeks** before the university's application deadline expires.

Use our Checklists→ Under Tools on our website







## 3. Assemble your documents

- Obtain required documents
- Have documents translated
- Obtain certified copies
- Check documents & information country by country at uni-assist.de



We need your certificates in their original language. If your certificates were not issued in German or English, we need an additional certified translation into German or English.

**Note:** You only need to submit your documents once, no matter how many universities you wish to apply to.







# 4. Apply online

- Register with the online portal
- Create and submit application online
- Additionally for a few universities: Print and sign your application forms
- Upload your documents











5. Pay all fees

In one application semester these handling fees apply:



Costs for the first desired course of study: 75.00 EUR
For each additional desired course of study: 30.00 EUR

#### Note

We are unable to procress your applications before you have paid the handling fees.



# 2. Apply in 6 steps via uni-assist



## 6. Send & Track

## Send

All required documents & (if applicable) signed application form



- - Check status in the online portal
  - Check evaluation result
  - Submit missing documents
  - Make changes to your application

**Note:** After a positive evaluation, uni-assist automatically forwards your application to the universities. The university decides on your admission and informs you of the decision.









## **US High School Diploma**

- regional accreditation
- High School Diploma official transcript from grade 9 to 12
- unweighted CGPA over 3.0
- grading scale








## **HSD-Subjects requirements**

- 4 units English (at least grade C): English IV or Honors or AP English,
- 2 units Second Language,
- 3 units Social Studies,
- 5 units in total Mathematics and Science (at least grade C):



2 or 3 units Science: Biology, Chemistry or Physics

Important: Not all subjects are recognized!

All requirements met  $\rightarrow$  admission to Studienkolleg









**HSD+** additional test

Important! Since admission for the winter semester 2019/2020:



- SAT and ACT are no longer relevant
- direct admission only with Advanced Placement exams (at College Board)








Direct admission with AP Exams- Subjects requirements

4 exams with at least grade 3 in:

- Mathematics
- 1 natural science subject
- 1 language
- 1 further subject











Direct admission with AP Exams- Subjects requirements

4 exams with at least grade 3 in:

- English
- 1 further foreign language
- 1 mathematical/natural science subject
- 1 further subject











**Completed Associate degree or 2 years of bachelor study** 

## **Subjects requirements:**

- 5 independent general education subjects (Math, Science, English, a Foreign language)
- 3 of those subjects in 3 consecutive semester courses









## **Deficits in the HSD**

- regular study courses at a recognized university can substitute the missing subjects
- CGPA below 2.95 cannot be balanced with study courses



Important: not all study courses are suitable!





## **Bachelor Degree**

- completed regular bachelor degree at a recognized university
- completion of all required credits (usually 120)
- overall CGPA and grading system
- degree certificate



→ direct admission in bachelor and master degree programs is possible





## **Common mistakes**

- unofficial transcript
- unweighted CGPA missing
- no US terminology in the HSD
- special requirements for university or course
- criteria/regulations by ZAB- subject to change
