
Why Germany? Because Germany...


Study in Germany



Land of Ideas

- ...has high academic and living standards at a reasonable cost
- ...offers an outstanding study and research infrastructure
- ...is home to more than 300,000 international university students
- ...Germany offers 1900+
 International Programs
- ...German degrees internationally recognized





Pursuing a Graduate Degree in Germany

- Good to know:



- A Bachelor's degree enables you to enroll in a Master's program
- At most universities is not possible to enroll in a PhD program with only a Bachelor's degree.
- For a PhD program, you must already have completed a Master's degree (in most cases).
- Universities usually require that your Bachelor's degree is in a similar field (i.e. your major) as the Master's program you are interested in, the so-called "field of studies requirement".
- In some cases, universities also require work experience as part of the application process.





What degree can you earn in Germany?

- Bachelor's (B.A., B.Sc., Bachelor of Engineering, etc.) – 3-4 years
- Master's (M.A., M.Sc., Master of Engineering, etc.) –
 1-2 years
- State examination (for medicine, law, teaching or pharmacy)
- Doctorate (PhD)
 - Independent PhD time to complete PhD varies
 - Graduate School 3 years

Research & Funding Institutions


















- More than 1,000 publicly funded research institutions
- Research expenditures: 90 bn euros = 2.98% GDP
- 652,000 people in the R&D sector
- Bilateral, European and multilateral cooperation with more than 155 countries







Steps - http://bit.ly/graduatedegree

1. First Step - Academic Requirements

- BA/MA in same or similar field
- 2. First Steps German Language Requirements
- For English programs often no German requirements
- For German programs TestDaF or DSH or Goethe-Certificate
- 3. Next Applying to Universities in Germany
- Check university website on how to apply (either directly or via www.uni-assist.de)
- 4. Finally Costs Associated with Studying in Germany
- Public universities no tuition fees (except for special programs)
- International Student Fees for non-EU citizens only in Baden-Wuerttemberg (as of Feb 2019)

Studying/Living in Germany: Costs

- Tuition-free programs at public universities*
- Semester fee: about €150-300/ semester – often includes public transportation pass
- Average costs of living €700-1000/ month
- Student discounts, e.g.:
 - Health care
 - University cafeteria
 - Museums, theatres, sights

5 .	Weimar	679,48 €


Most expensive cities:

5 .	Neu-Ulm	1149,03 €





- → 3-4 week courses
- → Humanities & Social Sciences
- → Min.1 year German required

Research

RISE professional

- → Internships for graduate students
- → 10-12 weeks
- → no German required

Research Grants

- → Short & long-term
- → All fields
- → German not required
