University Summer Course Grant

Who can apply?	Applications are open to students in bachelor's, master's and PhD degree programs in any subject area; bachelor's students must have completed at least two academic years at the start of the scholarship period
What can be funded?	Attendance of language and area studies courses as well as special language / terminology courses that are offered by German universities and affiliated language schools
Duration of the funding	At least 18 teaching days in the period from June to December
Value	One-off scholarship payment of €1,061Payments towards insurance coverageTravel allowance



Research Grants – Bi-nationally Supervised Doctoral Degrees / Cotutelle

Who can apply? Doctoral candidates and graduates who have admission to a doctoral program at the time they begin their grant-supported research What can be a) Doctorate with bi-national supervision following the "sandwich model:" Research stays at a state or state-reco-

gnized institution of higher education or a non-university research institute in Germany as part of a doctoral program in the home country OR b) Doctorate following the "Cotutelle" procedure: Funding of bi-national doctoral degrees at the home university and at a university in Germany according to the so-called "Cotutelle" procedure. The prerequisite is an individual cooperation contract between the participating universities about the doctoral project which is to be supervised. After successful completion of the doctorate, the German university and the foreign partner university award a doctoral degree together

12 to 18 months

Duration of the funding	10 weeks to 6 months (between mid- May and end of December)
Value	 DAAD monthly stipend (varies based on academic level) An additional stipend of at least €500 net per month provided by a host company Travel allowance Health, accident and personal/private liability insurance €160 for travel to the three-day RISE Germany meeting in Heidelberg For those who plan to attend a language course in Germany, DAAD covers 70 % of course fees (max. €250)

German Studies Research Grant

Who can apply?	Undergraduate and graduate students who are nominated by their department/program chairs
What can be funded?	Short-term research in Germany
Duration of the funding	1 to 2 months
Value	• US\$2,000 to US\$3,000

Contemporary German Literature Grant

Who can apply?	Graduate students (including doctoral candidates) working in the field of contemporary German literature are invited to apply
What can be funded?	Summer research on contemporary German literature
Duration of the funding	1 to 2 months
Value	• Up to US\$3000

Re-Invitation Grant

Who can apply?	Former holders of DAAD research grants or study scholarships who were funded for a period of over six months
What can be funded?	Research at universities, libraries, archives, institutes, or laboratories in Germany.
Duration of the funding	1 to 3 months
Value	 Monthly payments dependent on academic level

Leo Baeck Institute – DAAD Fellowship

Who can apply?	PhD candidates or recent PhDs (degree awarded within the last two years)
What can be funded?	Research project in New York or Germany on the social, communal, and intellectual history of German-speaking Jewry
Duration of the funding	1 to 2 months
Value	 The New York fellowship consists of a lump-sum award The fellowship for Germany follows the terms of award for the DAAD German Studies Research Grant





Conference Funding in German Studies	
Who can apply?	Faculty members and advanced students in the humanities, social sciences, and related fields
What can be funded?	Co-funded workshops, seminars, and conferences that embrace the interdisciplinary and/or comparative study of the history, politics, economics, law, society, culture, and the arts of Germany
Value	 A minimum of 50% of project costs have to be contributed from other sources, including the university hosting the event

RISE Worldwide

Who can apply?	Faculty, postdocs, PhD candidates, or researchers employed by or affiliated with an accredited academic institution or a non-profit research institution, working in the fields of natural sciences, earth sciences, engineering, medicine, mathematics, or computer science
What can be funded?	Hosting a German undergraduate research intern
Duration of the funding	Six weeks to three months between June and October in the US. Interns- hips in Canada are between 10 weeks and 3 months
Value	German students are awarded a DAAD scholarship which includes: • Monthly allowance (depending on target country) • Travel subsidy (depending on target country) • Health, accident and personal liability insurance • Participation in a RISE Worldwide alumni meeting in Germany

Postdoctoral Researchers International Mobility Experience (P.R.I.M.E.)

Who can apply?	Postdocs
What can be funded?	Temporary positions at German universities in place of conventional scholarships
Duration of the funding	Funding is provided for 18 months, in which 12 months have to be spent abroad and 6 months (re-integration phase) at a German university
Value	The DAAD will conclude a grant agreement with the respective German university covering the costs for the regular salary and the monthly expatriate allowance.

What can be funded?	Research in the fields of space, aeronautics, energy and transportation	
Duration of the funding	Varies based on academic level

Who can apply?	Scholars in all disciplines who hold a doctorate or other terminal degree and have an affiliation with a higher education institution
What can be funded?	Guest lectureships in Germany
Duration of the funding	3 months to 2 years
Value	 Visiting Professors are paid by the host institution according to stan- dard salary rates for civil servants and university faculty in Germany

What can be funded?	Online German language classes at the Goethe-Institut
Duration of the funding	Varies based on course duration
Value	Approximately US\$ 800

Who can apply?	Representatives from universities, re- search institutions, and funding agen- cies, as well as colleagues from the fields of education policy and politics
What can be funded?	DAAD-organized tour of higher education institutions in Germany
Duration of the funding	1 week
Value	 Most program-related costs are covered by DAAD; international travel is at participants' own expense

Group Study Visit

Who can apply?	Faculty
What can be funded?	Subject-related academic information visits to Germany organized by faculty members for groups of students
Duration of the funding	7 to 12 days
Value	 Up to €9,600 to subsidize room and board, depending on the size of the group and length of stay (€50 per participant per day)
